AT SEA EN ROUTE TO SOUTHAMPTON, UK



TIME CHANGE NOTICE

Please be advised that at midday (12.00pm this afternoon), the ship's time will be SET FORWARD BY ONE HOUR. Please set your watches forward by one hour at 12.00pm, Saturday 6 April.



Today is the final day of our transatlantic voyage, and QUEEN ELIZABETH's passage takes us over the Celtic Shelf. The seabed under the Celtic Sea is called the Celtic Shelf, part of the continental shelf of Europe. The northeast portion has a depth of between 90m and 100m, increasing towards Saint George's Channel. In the opposite direction, sand

between 90m and 100m, increasing towards Saint George's Channel. In the opposite direction, sand ridges pointing southwest have a similar height, separated by troughs approximately 50m deeper. These ridges were formed by tidal effects when the sea level was lower. We shall enter into Bishop Rock TSS at 6.00pm, passing the Isles of Scilly 16nm out to port. Heading Easterly, we expect to pass Lands End at 7.30pm, before entering the English Channel, keeping to the north of Casquets TSS.

'Dead Silence: The Fate of the 1719 Knight Expedition'
On June 5, 1719, Captain James Knight, a veteran of the venerable Hudson's Bay Company, set sail with two ships to look for the fabled Northwest Passage. Neither he nor his forty men were ever seen again. Three centuries later, John Geiger and a team of investigators traveled to a desolate outcrop in Hudson Bay to uncover the truth of Knight's disappearance. It took four arctic summers to gather the necessary evidence. This is the story both of a remarkable feat of archaeological detective work and of a group of brave men who died in the Arctic nearly three centuries ago. In the end, Knight's story is one of intrigue and betrayal.

OID YOU KNOW...






